Two products are safe & 98% effective

- We have copied the geometry of the Lippes Loop intrauterine device, renamed it “the Loop”, with no hormones or metals to be used safely for a woman’s first 15 to 20 child-bearing years.
- If a women wishes to have no more children (for her second 15 years of fertility), nonsurgical female contraception (QS) is safer than having her tubes tied.

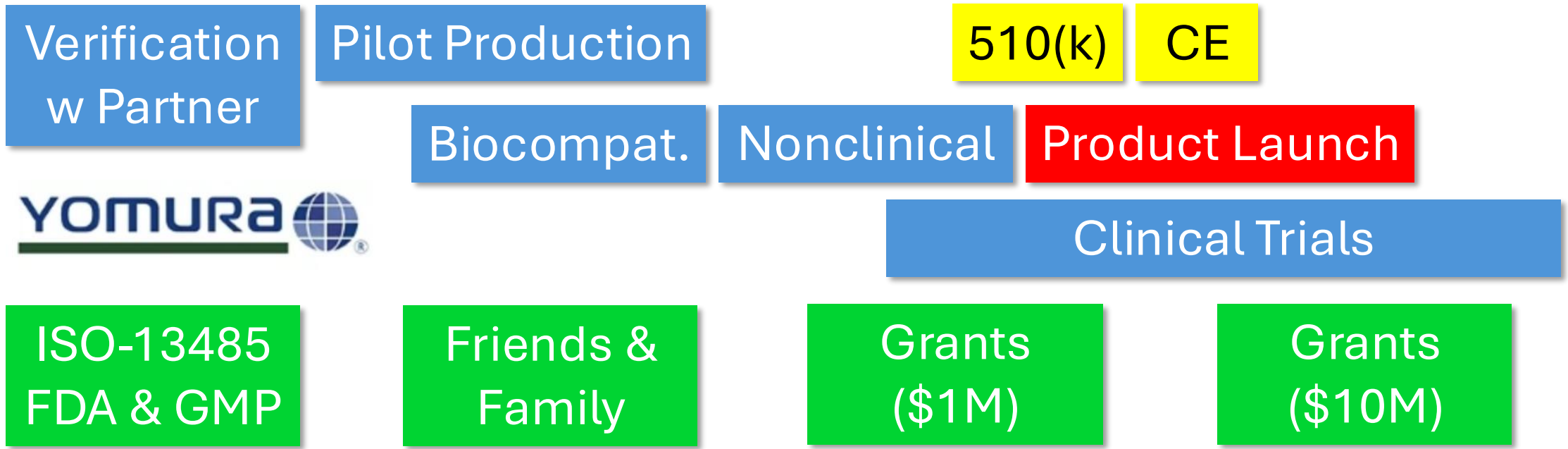

ISAF – better contraceptives for women



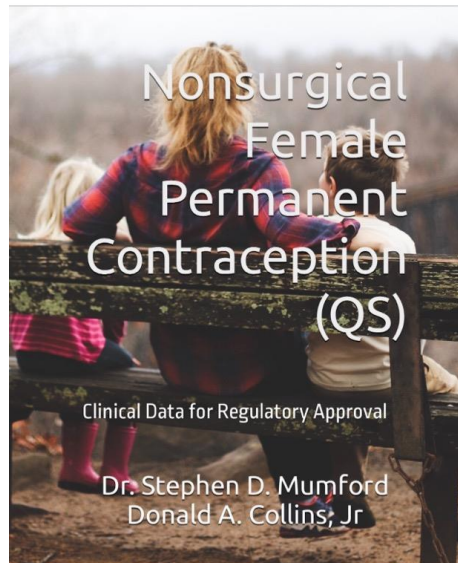
Market Sector	Long-acting reversible (LARC) and nonsurgical permanent contraception for women
Market Size	\$9 billion CAGR 6% U.S. contraceptive market serves 72 million girls and women
Market	(Primary) 40K OB/GYNs, (Secondary) 15K NPs, PAs, Midwives, and other trained HCP
Product 1*	The Loop IUD medical device is safe and 98% effective for 15 child-bearing years
Product 2*	QS nonsurgical permanent contraception medical device is safe and 98% effective

Patents	Both methods have been in the public domain for 5 decades with expired patents

Regulatory	Both are FDA Class III medical devices requiring PMA approval and clinical trials
Fundraising	\$10 million grants needed to bring both devices to market including clinical trials
Marketing	Our products may democratize contraception, the foundation for women's success
Management	Team with hundreds of years of combined experience in women's reproductive rights
Company	Incorporated nonprofit 501c3 in business for 48 years with 8 board members

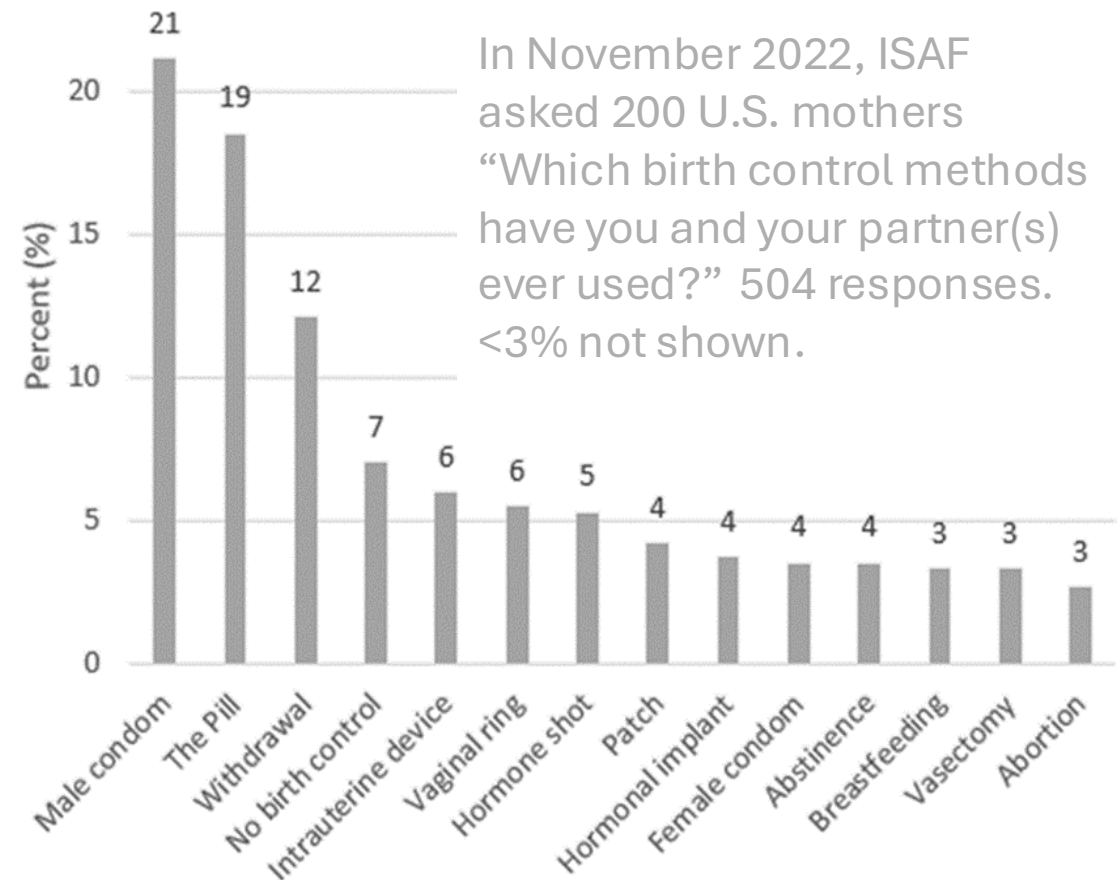

Male Condom # 1 method (ISAF)

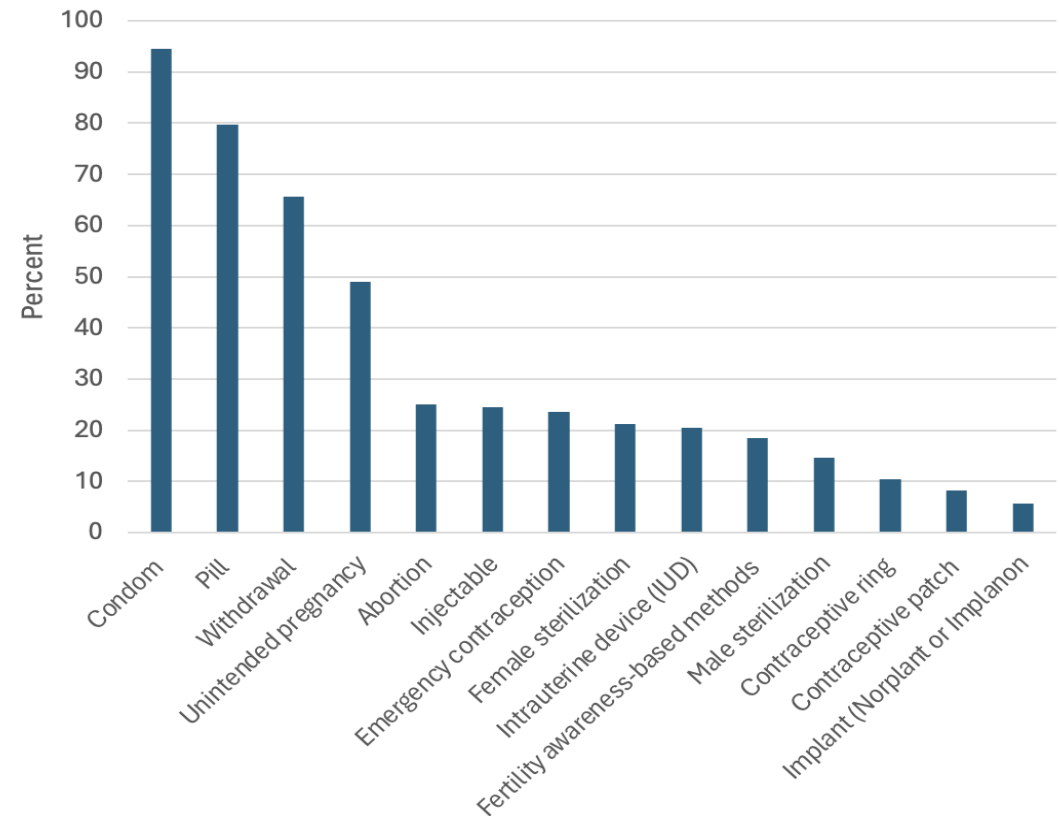
- Women are underserved in the U.S.
- 35% or 25 million of the 72.2 million U.S. women of childbearing age don't get adequate reproductive health care
- The average woman is fertile for 39 years and spends 3 decades trying to avoid an unintended pregnancy. She spends about 5 years pregnant, postpartum or trying to become pregnant.
- 51% of the 6.6 million pregnancies in the U.S. yearly are unintended
- By age 45, half of women will have had an unintended pregnancy and almost a quarter (23.7%) will have had an abortion



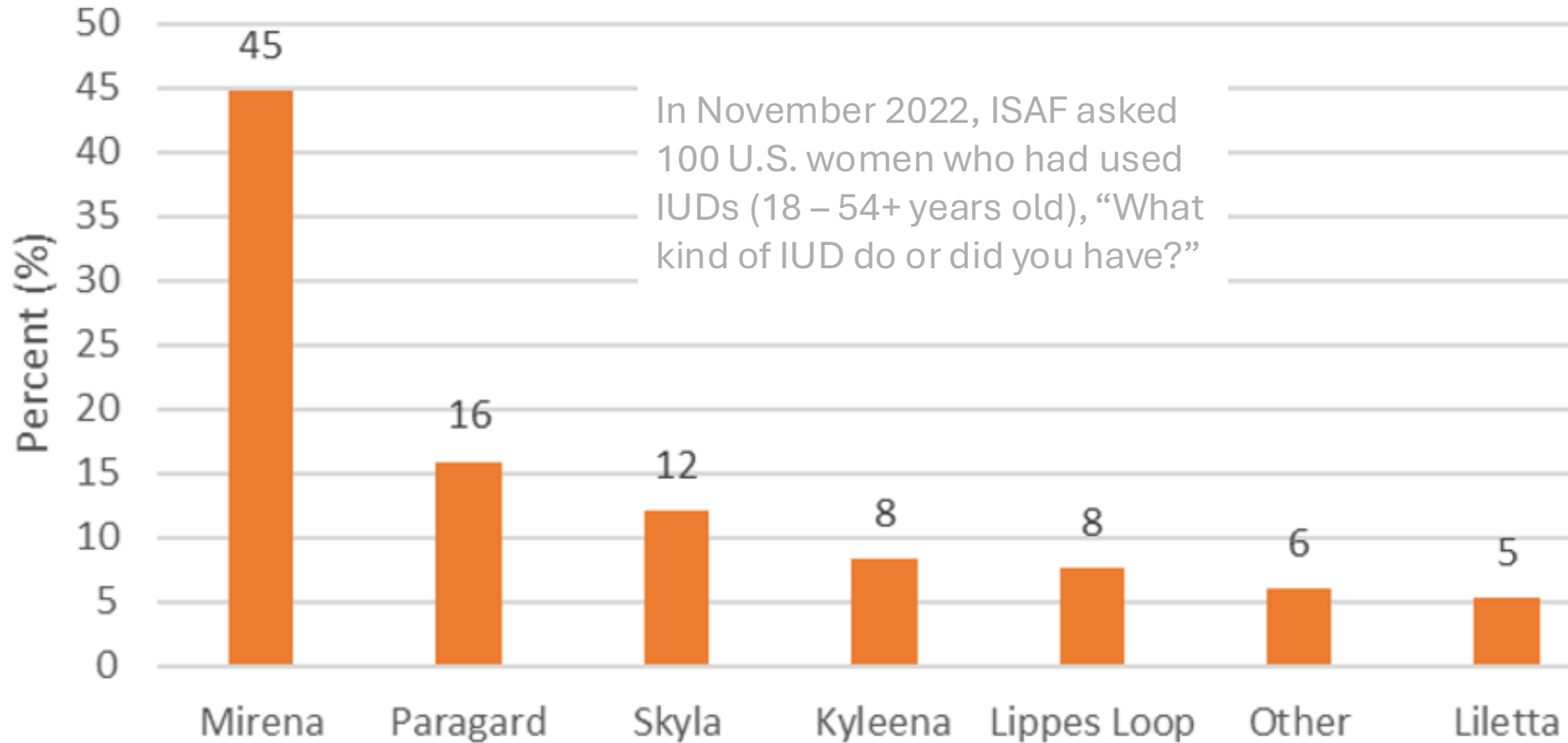
Male Condom # 1 method (CDC)

- Male condom is most used method
- This report focuses on information collected from the 11,695 women ages 15–49 interviewed in the 2015–2019 National Survey of Family Growth, a nationally representative survey conducted by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention’s National Center for Health Statistics. Most estimates shown are based on data on contraceptive methods ever used by the 10,122 interviewed women who had ever had sexual intercourse with a male partner.

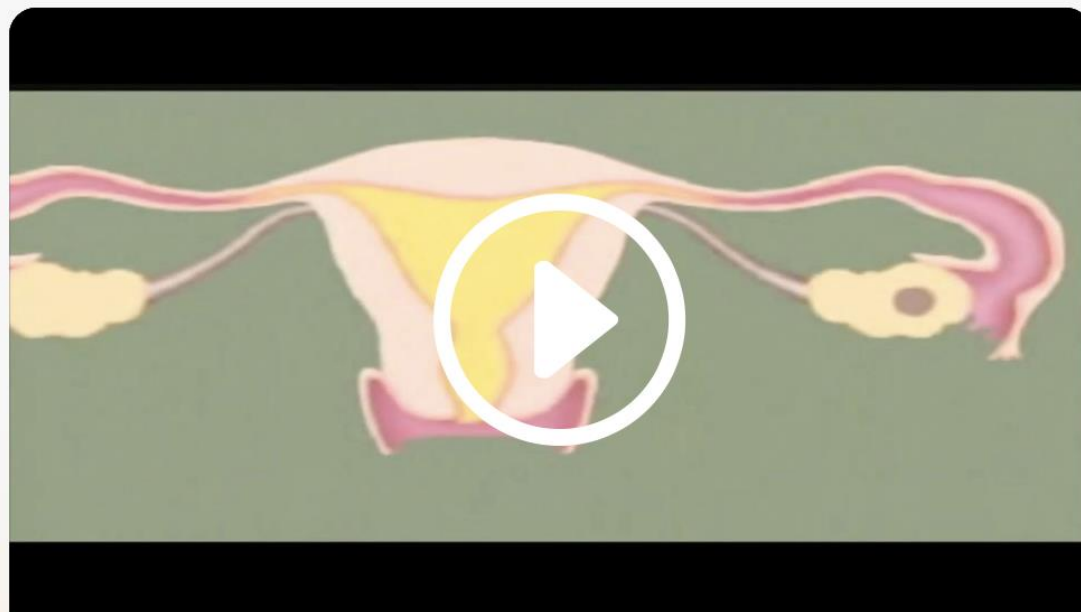
Contraceptive Methods Women Ages 15 - 49 Have Ever Used: United States, 2015–2019



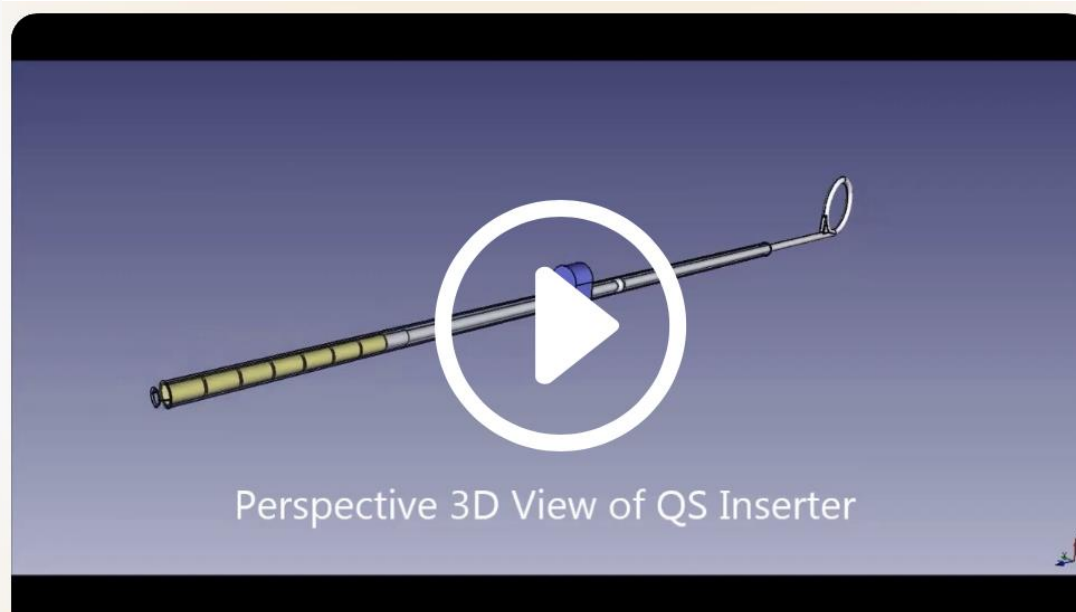
